

In 1913 – Just over a century ago – the evangelist Rev. George Bennard was invited to speak at a revival meeting in Pokagon, Michigan (USA). It was a time when the Spirit of God was breaking out in different places, all around the world, but not, it seemed, in the small wooden chapel of Pokagon. Throughout his sermon George was constantly heckled and shouted down by a group of people who were intent on disturbing the meeting.

The heckling was so extreme that the evangelist felt ‘as burdened as Christ carrying the cross for his Crucifixion’. So he studied everything he could find in reference to the cross, and over the weeks that followed wrote the words to the hymn ‘The Old Rugged Cross,’ that still ranks today as one of the most beloved songs in Christendom.

On a hill far away stood an old rugged cross, the emblem of suffering and shame; and I love that old cross where the dearest and best for a world of lost sinners was slain.


O that old rugged cross, so despised by the world, has a wondrous attraction for me; for the dear Lamb of God left his glory above to bear it to dark Calvary.

In that old rugged cross, stained with blood so divine, a wondrous beauty I see, for 'twas on that old cross Jesus suffered and died, to pardon and sanctify me.

To that old rugged cross I will ever be true, its shame and reproach gladly bear; then he'll call me some day to my home far away, where his glory forever I'll share.

So I'll cherish the old rugged cross, till my trophies at last I lay down; I will cling to the old rugged cross, and exchange it someday for a crown.
