

A Secretary's Story - Part 2

In the newsletter of May 14th, I asked the rhetorical question of why some Christians skip over sections of the Bible. Today I ask "Do you believe what you read?" 'Yes, of course!' is the reply, but ...really? We'd all agree when Jesus said that He is 'THE way, THE truth & THE life, NO ONE comes to the Father but by ME'. Jesus says he is the ONLY way to the Father in heaven, not just one of many ways or even one of a few. His way is the only way. Now that may sound rather 'exclusive' and not politically correct nowadays, and that is His claim. But the Good News is that His way is open to all, it just needs to be accepted.

Yet many Christians still fillet the Bible because some parts seem 'uncomfortable'. They may claim that certain passages were written 'just for that time' or were cultural, not intended for the 21st century. But the Bible is not a bag of 'pick & mix' sweets. We can't select only the parts we like and leave aside, ignore or disbelieve others. And any medicine is much less effective if diluted because we don't like the taste!

Of course, we recognise that some parts of the Bible are poetical and not literal or historical and that can complicate matters but God is God for ALL time, for ALL cultures and the Bible makes it abundantly clear that nothing is to added or taken away (Deut 4:2, Rev 22:18, etc.).

So to return to my analogy with crime fiction, if you don't like a particular section so don't read it, it can so easily lead to a misunderstanding of the whole novel. So it is with the Bible, but the consequences will be much more serious.
