



Good habits for godly people: self reflection

We have a large mirror in our lounge. Its main purpose is to make the room look larger and brighter. But...when you have a mirror in the living area, who can help it; you've got to have a look at yourself from time. How am I doing, am I getting a bit too much middle age spread? Is it a bad hair day? Does this hat give me the proper South Downs Country Gent look? It's not just about vanity, it is a means of checking up on myself.

The same would be true when it comes to the good habit of self reflection. Not the navel gazing, self obsessed kind of "I can only think about myself" type. No, more of a healthy "How am I doing really?" kind of look at my life.

Jews practice this traditionally before the Day of Atonement. For ten days they take a good hard look at themselves in the light of the ten commandments. I can't help but think that the world would be a better place if this were a common practice for all nationalities and cultures.

Jesus' famous statement about the "log in your own eye" points us towards a healthy habit of self reflection. Asking ourselves, "Did I contribute to this conflict?" "Do I not have that same annoying habit that I criticize in others?"

Godly people who look at themselves in the light of God's mercy can afford a bit of self criticism. Paul compares the Christian life to the athlete and the soldier. For both, the question of "How can I do better?" is part of their lifestyle and training. No condemnation, just a tool to check what's happening in my life. Shall we give it a go?
